Frank W. Bachelor, BSc, Ph.D.

Frank was born in the United States and received his first degree in Chemistry from the University of California Berkeley. He received his Ph.D. from MIT, where he studied with Professor George Buchi and worked on the determination of the structure of the alkaloid aconitine. He then completed a post-doctoral fellowship with Professor Weigand in Munich and a two year as research associate with Professor Emil White at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore. In 1963 he took up the post of assistant professor at the University of Calgary from which he retired in 1989. He currently operates his own consulting company, FWB Chemical Consulting. During his career he has achieved many awards and honors including the Montreal

Medal in 1994 for contributions to the Profession of Chemistry. He has been Director of Scientific Affairs, Chairman of the Board, Vice-President and President of the CIC and was a member of the organizing committee and first President of the ACPA. He has been on the Board of Directors for ACPA since its inception.

Duncan Stanners, B.Sc.

Duncan received his initial degree from the University of Waterloo and began his career with Shell at the Oakville Research Center, Agricultural Chemistry Division. He then progressed to Senior Research Chemist working on epoxy resins and styrene and moved to the styrene monomer business unit as Senior Analyst, Market Development. In 1988 he came to Calgary as Staff Analyst, Chemicals Planning in Corporate Strategies and become coordinator, Business strategies in Shell Canada Chemical Company. His current position is Manager – Laboratory, responsible for analytical chemistry labs and labs supporting Shells' downstream business.

Duncan has held many positions on external committees and boards and is currently the Company's alternate representative on the Conference Board of Canada's Innovation Council. His community service includes coaching soccer and basketball, United Way Calgary Research Center leader and Junior Achievement teacher – The Business Game 1994-98 at Sir Winston Churchill High, Economics of Staying in School, 1997/99. He became a member of the ACPA Board of Directors in 1999.
