

ACPA Professional Chemist Stamp

Rationale

The hexagon and circle of the benzene ring lend themselves well to a distinctive Professional Chemist stamp. Most other professional stamps are simple circle-within-circle designs that can be hard to distinguish unless examined closely.

The benzene ring is a well-known chemical symbol. In addition, benzene is important in many ways to the chemical, petroleum and environmental industries of Alberta.

Description

Inside the hexagon and wrapped around the circle is the full name of our Association.

Inside the circle is the member's registration number and a space for signatures, initials or handwritten dates.

Between the lines is the member's name, abbreviated to fit as necessary. As is usually the case with professional stamps, members must provide a version of their name that will fit in the space provided.

Below the member's name is the member's official title in full: "Professional Chemist".

Usage

Only full members of ACPA are permitted to use this title in the Province of Alberta, under provincial regulations approved in December of 2001.

A stamp is supplied to all full members of ACPA, along with a certificate authorizing the use of the title.

Getting Your Stamp
